Chop Gate Community Access Defibrillator - Opening Ceremony

The Community Public Access Defibrillator (CPAD) at the Buck Inn, Chop Gate was recently installed and made 'live' by the Community First Responder (CFR) Team supported by Yorkshire Ambulance Service and now serves the community as an additional emergency resource in the event of a cardiac arrest. The device is available to in addition to the small group of volunteers who make up your CFR Team (callsign NCR17).

Although the CPAD is now officially a 'live' resource for the Yorkshire Ambulance Service there was an opening ceremony held for the public on Thursday 7th March at 10:30am.

Councillor Bryn Griffiths (a major contributor to the project) came along to perform the ceremony. Councillor Griffiths said it was very reassuring to have a defibrillator installed in this rural community, but obviously hoped that it would never have to be used, however, if it manages to save just one life then the fundraising effort has been worth it.

Councillor Griffiths went onto say that this was the second Defibrillator he had helped support through using his allocated County Locality Grant fund. He said "I try and use these grants to support all my parishes, with projects that directly help local communities. I know how hard it can be for relatively small communities to raise funding and so I'm very happy to support this particular scheme."

He thanked everybody who contributed to the project and helped Gary Silver (Co-ordinator CFR) and his team make this scheme happen.

Councillor Griffiths urged people to attend the training session that is planned for Tuesday 26th March 2019 at 7pm in Chop Gate Village Hall as the training is not complicated and the Defibrillator is really very easy to use. Of the event, Councillor Griffith said, "It is with great pleasure that I announce the Defibrillator officially open for use."

Gary Silver thanked Councillor Griffiths for opening the Defibrillator this day. He also thanked Dawson and Evans Electrical Contractors

from Redcar for the electric work installing the Defibrillator without charge, and Helen and Wolfgang Barth, the publicans at the Buck Inn for allowing the

Defibrillator to be erected on the pub's wall and for supplying the power to it for free.

Gary thanked everybody from both within and without the immediate community who had contributed money towards the cost of the Defibrillator and cabinet.

The Birds in Your Garden

We've all read and heard much about climate change and its effects, but what about our garden birds? What is likely to happen to them as the changes continue, probably at an ever-increasing rate?

Three responses in particular are becoming apparent in our gardens. Earlier nesting, longer stays by summer migrants (balanced by the absence or shorter stays of winter migrants) and species changes.

Earlier nesting :Spring has been getting warmer at an increasing rate since the 1970s with leaves appearing ever earlier. Logically, insects that feed on foliage do the same, and as most garden birds depend on insects to feed their young, they have brought forward their laying dates to match.

Great Tits for example are laying eggs around 11 days earlier than 40 years ago, and Blue Tits have shown similar trends. Species such as Blackbirds, Robins and House Sparrows which make several breeding attempts each year, also nest earlier, but are less likely to be seriously affected if they get it wrong.

Species changes : Research predicts that European breeding birds will move north by an average of 300 miles in response to climate change. For example, Green Woodpeckers and Nuthatches will become more common hereabouts, and many southern species could appear in our gardens. Similarly, plants such as olive trees and Mediterranean herbs will be able to thrive here, paralleled no doubt, by the loss of some of our current plant species.

Since Blackbirds, robins, blue tits, greenfinches and the other 'top 10' species on the Garden Birdwatch list are found in the different climates across Europe from Spain to Sweden, a warming of three degrees is unlikely to affect their incidence in the UK much.

Migrants: Migrant birds too are changing their behaviour, with some species no longer coming here and others becoming residents, whilst autumn departures for warmer climes are delayed by up to a month. The UK breeding populations of Blackcaps and Chiffchaffs have both more than doubled since 1970. Average temperatures here have increased by almost 1°C in recent decades and familiar birds such as Swallows, have responded by leaving for Africa later. Others, such as garden warblers and whitethroats, are also enjoying warmer British weather for longer.

The effects of these changes are compounded by those in farming practices. Some bird species have vanished from parts of England, particularly where monoculture farming gives them no suitable alternative habitats in which to feed and breed. Add to all this the long-term reductions in habitat quality due to increased autumn planting and the ending of widespread manuring of the land, and the future looks bleak for many species.

The lack of invertebrates has been in the news recently too, both in the UK and in Germany – when did you last have to clean flies off the bonnet of your car after a long journey? Secondary effects on birds due to human activities that reduce the availability of their food, such as pesticides and herbicides are becoming serious too. For example, years of herbicide use means that many of the broadleaved plants which used to support a range of insects as well as providing seeds no longer appear. Stubble and fallow land used to support large numbers of ground feeding birds too, both have long gone in most places.
